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Introduction

The Centre for Community-Driven Research (CCDR) is a non-profit organisation bringing much needed change to the way we think about community engagement in health and research. Our vision is to facilitate meaningful connection between service providers, research organisations, the non-profit sector, practitioners, industry, government, and the communities for which they provide a service or aim to benefit. CCDR listens to the issues that people (patients), researchers, and healthcare and industry partners face and develop solutions - through community engagement - to solve those issues. We do this so that research, healthcare programs, policies and products being developed can reach the patients at the bedside sooner, and better address the needs patients and their families.

CCDR currently have offices in Australia, Switzerland and the United Kingdom and aim to reach our goal of a more person-centric health sector globally through our core programs; the Patient (Personal) Experience Expectations and Knowledge Program (PEEK), the National Patient Organisation Network program, and Piloting Community Engagement and Community-Based Health Delivery Approaches (Pilots).

Patient organisations are the heart and soul of the health system. They provide linkage between the patients and families that they support, and government, researchers, clinicians, service providers, policy-makers and industry. The NPON program provides a space for patient organisations that work at the grass-roots level, to come together – free from distraction – to develop solutions that work best for their patient populations. The NPON program is about developing practical solutions to health system challenges and actively designing systems and policies that work better for patients and their families.

To really move forward and accept patient organisations as part of the health system and their important role informing decision about health, we have to consider the infrastructure needed to support sustainability and independence in community engagement. When we talk about infrastructure we often think of the physical structures and systems needed to deliver health services, basic research, clinical trials and so on. What we do not often talk about is the infrastructure needed to create an environment that supports systematic and independent community engagement. It is this kind of infrastructure that the NPON helps to achieve.

CCDR has conducted an audit of patient organisations in the Switzerland. This gives us a picture of the patient-organisation capacity within each country and then allow us to alert all organisations to the NPON Switzerland opportunity.



Aim

The aim of stage one of the audit was to:

To identify charities that are focused on health or chronic conditions registered federally in Switzerland
To identify charities that are patient organisations, that is, provide patient support, information or advocacy
To understand the breadth of disease areas covered by patient organisation in Switzerland

Method and results

In Switzerland, the two forms of legal entities that are commonly used for charitable purposes are foundations and associations.

According to the Swiss Civil Code, there are two non-corporate legal entities that can be registered in Switzerland:

- foundations
- associations

The main difference between a Swiss foundation and association resides is that the latter is made of members. It is required for an association to have at least 2 members for it to be created.

Switzerland recognises three main categories of foundations including family foundations and private foundations, foundations operating as pension funds or foundations set up for the benefit of the general public.

The Federal Supervisory Authority for Foundations sits under the Federal Department of the Interior and is responsible for overseeing foundations operating at the national and/or international levels.

The registration in the Register of Commerce is not mandatory for associations having a non-profit purpose. This is therefore not reliable data on the number of associations established in Switzerland and this audit has only used the federal register.

Stage 1: Long list development

A directory of charities is kept by the Federal Department of the Interior¹ All foundations subject to Confederation supervision are registered in the electronic directory. There are 4,899 organisations registered in the database.

The directory was accessed on 1 February 2022. Within the directory's search function, it is possible to filter charities and associations by key words. Each organisation may be tagged with more than one keyword. The following inclusion and exclusion criteria were applied to develop an initial list of charities and associations for review. 1516 organisations were identified in the initial list of which 379 were duplicates leaving a total of 1137 organisations for review.

Stage 2: Long list manual review

For each of the 1137 organisations identified, a spreadsheet was developed with a broad description of the organisation's purpose. The broad description was taken from the register kept by the Federal Department of the Interior and translated into English.

Two researchers reviewed the list of organisations to identify those that aimed to provide service to a specific patient population or the health of the general population.

Following this review 267 organisations were marked as potential patient organisations and 1249 were marked for exclusion.

Stage 3: Organisation review for inclusion/exclusion

A final review was conducted on the 267 organisations marked as potential patient organisations. In this review, the website of each organisation was searched to verify that the organisation met minimum criteria as a patient organisation including:

- Organisations that provide information to support a specific patient population or for the general health of the broad population and/or
- Organisations that provide information to services to a specific patient population or for the general health of the broad population (housing and accommodation were excluded as a service) and/or
- Organisations that advocate on behalf of a specific patient population or for the general health of the broad population

A second review of all excluded organisations was also conducted to confirm the classification of the organisation, that is, the reason for exclusion.


Stage 4: Classification of organisations

A review of the 107 patient organisations was conducted to assign the disease area that the organisation primarily focuses on. This was done using main level of nomenclature from the International Classification of Disease (ICD-11)². An additional descriptive classification was also given using common terms for disease areas.

Figure 1: ICD 11 classification of organisations





While this audit has only used the federal register, the next phase will be inclusive of patient organisations registered at a cantonal level and will be open to any associations having a non-profit purpose including:

- Organisations that provide information to support a specific patient population or for the general health of the broad population and/or
- Organisations that provide information to services to a specific patient population or for the general health of the broad population (housing and accommodation were excluded as a service) and/or
- Organisations that advocate on behalf of a specific patient population or for the general health of the broad population
